Rules & Information

- The competition is open only to farmers living in and farming in the Republic of Ireland.
- The competition is open to farmers who are producing liquid or manufacturing milk.
- In relation to the maximum number of farmers a co-op may nominate, the following criteria apply: Co-ops with an annual quota under 200 million litres: 1 nomination; Co-ops with an annual quota between 200 million - 500 million litres: 2 nominations; Co-ops with an annual quota between 500 million litres - one thousand million litres: 3 nominations; and Co-ops with an annual quota greater than one thousand million litres: 4 nominations.
- The minimum qualifying standard for entry is TBC of 20,000 or less/ml average per month; and average SCC 250,000 or less/ml with no count over 400,000 ml in any given month of the year in question.
- Herds restricted within the period in question or currently are not eligible for nomination.
- The nominations received will be assessed by an independent panel of judges. The preliminary assessment of entrants is based on the entry form as completed by the nominator.
- The judges may select a shortlist of candidates who, at that stage, may be adjudged to be equal in terms of their records - with the selection of the winner made following a visit by the judges to each finalist's farm. For those short-listed, the judges will score from 100 points for the entry form and hard data; and 100 points for the farm visit.
- It is entirely at the discretion of the judges each year to select a category award or Special Judge's Award. It is entirely at the discretion of the judges each year to select whether category prizes should be awarded for titles such as best family/small farm or for care of the environment, or whether to present national category awards for either a manufacturing or liquid milk supplier.
- The judge's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered in to.
- The overall national winner of the NDC Quality Milk Awards is excluded from re-nomination for this award programme for a period of 3 full years (ie eligible for re-nomination within or after the 4th year after the original winning nomination)
- The title and concept of the National Dairy Council Quality Milk Awards are copyright protected and can not be used by third parties or other commercial interests without prior approval from the organisers and sponsors.
